FAITH FACTS – Did you know that after writing a grant to the Ballou Channing District, the Directors of Religious Education and Faith Formation in the Southeast area have been awarded \$2,500 for a consultant? Our UUFF Director of Faith Formation, Debi Keller Wood, along with the DRE's from Middleboro and Sharon will begin interviewing for the position this week. The Consultant will organize and facilitate nine monthly meetings in which the group explores aspects of their practice as religious educators. These areas will include: congregational dynamics, conflict resolution, anti- oppression work (dismantling white supremacy; rank, power, and privilege), multi-generational worship, pastoral care, family faith formation outside of Sunday mornings, and community outreach.

THE FIRE OF COMMITMENT – As of April 5, we have commitments of \$165,578 or 65.7% of our goal of \$252,000. So far, 77 pledge units have sent in their forms. We are hoping to receive 80 more completed pledge units. The campaign runs through April 13.
