**SUNDAY SERVICE NOVEMBER 22, 10:00 AM – Thanksgiving Sunday - The Rev. David Kohlmeier**  
We shall continue our tradition of honoring Thanksgiving Sunday with a symbolic common meal. This will be a time for centering in gratitude. Everyone is invited to have a bread and a drink of their choice. Traditionally on this day we share cornbread and apple cider, so you're invited to do that, or to bring whatever you have. Even though we are physically apart we share one earth, and through this shared meal of gratitude, we shall connect in spirit.

**GREEN TIPS** – Leave them alone! Leaves are more valuable than gold. They serve as a home and dinner for caterpillars. They clean our air. We often see them in this season as just a bother when they fall. But before we were here, the dropped leaves of autumn became and replenished our rich soil. Rather than “cleaning and discarding” all the leaves in your yard and garden, let them serve as the perfect winter mulch. Cut them when you mow your lawn to fertilize the natural way. Let the fallen leaves rejuvenate your soil in your garden beds and protect your plants with free mulch given by your trees.

**DON'T FORGET TO UPDATE YOUR ZOOM APP** – Hopefully you are all getting more comfortable



using Zoom. (If not, there are people at UU Falmouth willing to help.) It is important to make sure you are using the latest version. Here are the steps you need to take to see if you are up-to-date: 1. Open your Zoom app. 2. Click on your tiny profile image at the top right (either your initials or your Zoom profile photo). 3. Click “Check for Updates” near the bottom of the menu and follow the on-screen instructions. The whole process should take no more than 1-3 minutes.
