The concert will feature Piano Quartet #1 in C minor by Gabriel Fauré; Sonata in Bb for violin and piano by Mozart (K378); and the premiere performance of Bach's Cello Suite #1 in G major, arranged for a viola and cello duo by cellist Judith Glixon.
