SUNDAY SERVICE October 20, 2024 at 10 AM at the Meeting House and via Zoom.

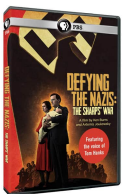

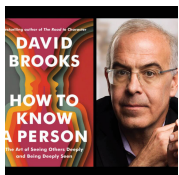

“WAMPANOAG LANGUAGE” L.I.N.K. PROGRAM SATURDAY, OCTOBER 26 FROM 1-3 PM

at the Meeting House. Although not fluently spoken for over 150 years, the return of the Wampanoag language to its people has marked a renewal of cultural knowledge and connection. Dr. Nitana Hicks Greendeer, a member of the Mashpee Wampanoag Tribe who has worked for over 20 years in tribal language, will discuss the story of loss and reclamation. She will also talk about the Wampanoag Nation’s efforts to bring it back as a principal means of communication for its people.
