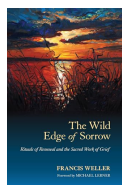
SUNDAY SERVICE January 4, 2026 at 10 AM at the Meeting House and via Zoom.

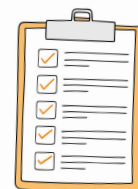
“GOOD NEWS” COFFEE HOUR, Saturday, January 10 from 9-10:30 AM at the Meeting House.

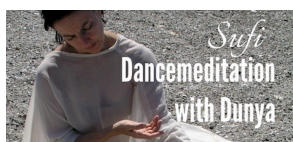
SUNDAY SERVICE January 11, 2026 at 10 AM at the Meeting House and via Zoom.
