### SUNDAY SERVICE May 4, 2025 at 10 AM at the Meeting House and via Zoom.

The Sacred Power of Imagination led by Rosa Whiting, written by Rev. Rali Weaver. What if imagination isn't just for artists and dreamers, but a spiritual tool for building compassion? In this sermon, we'll explore how using our imagination can help us build a better tomorrow. We will consider the movements of the past that have spurred change for the future and how we can do the same thing too.

**MINISTER CONTRACT-TO-CALL PROCESS BEGINS!** This month we begin the process of discerning whether to call Rev. Rali Weaver into settled ministry with UU Falmouth. The discernment process will be led by a team consisting of Judy Lynch, Tom Kirkman, and Larry Ladd (facilitator).

Rev. Rali Weaver has prepared a ministerial record or packet, which is standard practice for candidates for settled ministry. The packet, available on her website <a href="https://www.raliweaver.com/">https://www.raliweaver.com/</a>, tells you a lot about her. There are also two copies in the library that you can borrow.

**During the week of May 5,** you can schedule a one-on-one conversation with Rali by making an appointment in person, via Zoom, or on the phone using this scheduling app: <a href="https://revraliweaver.youcanbook.me">https://revraliweaver.youcanbook.me</a>. You can ask questions or make observations. There will be group discussions via Zoom with key committees. You are also encouraged to write or email Larry Ladd to ask questions or offer comments. The Peace of Trees led by Rev. Fred Small; service associate Julie DeSorgher. "The rush and pressure of modern life are a form, perhaps the most common form, of its innate violence." wrote Trappist monk and peace activist Thomas Merton. "The frenzy of our activism neutralizes our work for peace... It destroys the fruitfulness of our own work, because it kills the root of inner wisdom which makes work fruitful." As we work together for social and environmental justice, how do we remain grounded in a peaceful spirit? What can we learn from trees?

Rev. Fred Small is a UU pastor, singer-songwriter, and former environmental lawyer who serves as Minister for Climate Justice at the Arlington Street Church in Boston.
