In this sermon, we explore The Art of Losing—not just the pain of letting go, but the strange grace within it. Whether it's relationships, roles, certainty, or control, what might we learn from loosening our grip? Drawing from poetry, spiritual practice, and UU values, we'll consider how loss can become not just an ending, but an invitation to release, to reimagine, and to return to what matters most. Join us as we honor the beauty, sorrow, and liberation found in letting go.

They are invited to listen to churched and unchurched people who are hurting, turning challenging moments into times of hope. Our chaplains serve patients of all faiths and denominations.
