Rali receives urgent calls from people in the congregation and neighbors across the Cape who are struggling to bridge the gap between paychecks? For many, the high cost of living here means a single unexpected expense can lead straight to a housing crisis. Rev. Rali uses the Minister's Discretionary Fund to provide this emergency help quickly. This includes things like grocery cards, transportation, and critically needed emergency hotel rooms on cold winter nights for those facing eviction and homelessness so they can connect with long-term services.

On this Christmas Eve, the night the stories tell us a homeless family sought shelter, our UU Falmouth Fellowship continues its tradition: The entire offering will go directly to the Minister's Discretionary Fund to provide hope and immediate assistance to our most vulnerable neighbors.

This Sunday's sermon will ask the question "What doorways have you passed through recently and what doorways are ahead of you?"


