L.I.N.K BOOK TALK: Nothing More of This Land, Wednesday, July 30 at 5 PM at the Meeting

House, UU Falmouth collaborated with L.I.N.K. (Linking Indigenous and Non-Indigenous Knowledge) in a year-long educational series in 2024. As we continue our partnership, all are invited to hear award-winning Wampanoag journalist Joseph Lee talk about the complexity and ever-changing nature of Indigenous identity.

In Nothing More Of This Land, Lee deftly addresses the many threats facing U.S. tribes today from their complex relationship with local, state, federal, and even their own tribal governments—to the fight between white-driven conservation efforts and Indigenous land management. In doing so, he

argues that while Indigenous identity is often tied to ancestors, land, and the past, it is also everchanging and reliant on how Indigenous people choose to engage with their own communities today.
