SUNDAY SERVICE May 31, 2026 at 10 AM at the Meeting House and via Zoom

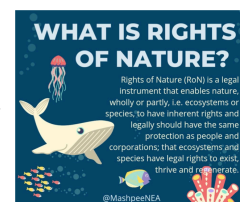

Bill will revisit some of Moore’s thoughts to explore how we might spend some quality time with ourselves to manage and shape living so as to give our ordinary life depth and value.

Rev. Bill Zelazny was ordained as a Unitarian Universalist minister in 1992. He has served four congregations, the most recent was Channing Memorial Church in Newport, RI from which he retired in June 2025.
