RELIGIOUS SERVICES IN AUGUST

August 6th—*Examining Our Roots*, led by Daniel Mark Welch. One of the six sources of Unitarian Universalism is “Jewish and Christian teachings that call us to respond to God’s love by loving our neighbors as ourselves.” Is this truly an accurate representation of our relationship with Christianity? We will explore this question in relation to both our individual congregation and our faith at large.

On this Sunday, the Choir will perform “How Good” by Michael Engelhardt, an anthem in gospel style with lyrics based on Psalm 133 celebrating “how good and how pleasant it is” when people from various backgrounds come together to form one unified body. We will be joined by Chris Santos, drummer; and tenor soloist, Matthew Newcombe.

August 13th—*Wonder and Awe*, led by Rev. Saramaria Allenby. We live out the principles of Unitarian Universalism with a “living tradition” of wisdom and spirituality, drawn from sources as diverse as science, poetry, scripture, and personal experience. In the first of the six sources, UU congregations affirm and promote the “Direct experience of that transcending mystery and wonder, affirmed in all cultures, which moves us to a renewal of the spirit and an openness to the forces which create and uphold life.” Join Rev. Saramaria for an exploration of wonder, mystery and awe with science, poetry and scripture that moves us and renews us all in a spirit of openness to the forces that help us to create our life together.

August 20th—There will be no service at UU Falmouth on this Sunday as those involved in planning and running all our services take a much deserved break.

Hello again Members and Friends,

From the Governing Board perspective as of July 16, here are the governance highlights since last month:

Personnel – Kit, the communications hub of our community, was on vacation June 22–July 6, but otherwise on the job keeping us connected. Fred, accompanied by Nancy, inspired our choir to give us wonderful music. On July 9, he led one of the best, most joyful services we have had in recent times. Rev. Saramaria was on the job in June but on vacation for the month of July. We are fortunate in our staff and glad the congregation approved 6.5% raises for them effective July 1.

Retreat June 23 – The new Board met in the East Wing from 10 AM to 4 PM. The agenda was primarily administrative work that now falls to us: use of the building and building security, communications, and staff job descriptions and management. Committee liaison assignments were accepted as follows:

The liaisons will attend committee meetings to provide a direct link with the Board. David Mark Welch will be recruiting 3-5 members for the Committee on Ministry for the approval of the congregation this fall. The Hospitality and Stewardship/Development committees need to be rebuilt.

Meetings – The Leadership Council met for the first time in a long time and will continue meeting every 2-3 months under the leadership of Julie DeSorgher. The purpose is coordination and cooperation. The Transition Task Force, initiated by Steve Treistman this past spring, aided transition to the new Board by surveying the congregation, researching options for hiring ministers, and conducting a congregational healing session on July 15. Two subgroups under the Governing Board are at work, one to revise the format of the financial reports to make them more comprehensible, and the second to audit FY 22 and FY 23 finances. All committees have been asked to report monthly to the congregation in the Sandscript.

New communications pathways – Governing Board members will be available at a table during Sunday coffee hours. Please come talk with us. There's a new bulletin board in the coffee room for members and friends to post community notices; no rules, go ahead and post. The regular Governing Board meetings on the third Thursday of each month will be open to all members and friends, and agendas will go out to all in advance. I hope you take advantage of this time to help us do what we can to help UU Falmouth thrive.

General Assembly Summary

The UUA General Assembly was held June 21-25 in Pittsburgh. Larry Ladd was our delegate. A good [summary of the whole conference](#) has been published by the Religious News Service.

Many of the events are [publicly available via streaming](#), such as the Service of the Living Tradition, all business sessions including the debate and amendment process of Article II, and the June 25 Sunday Service that our congregation watched together.

The new proposed [Article II wording](#) (where the "Seven Principles" now reside) was preliminarily approved, with amendments. The bylaws require a two-year vote, so the new wording will require a vote (2/3) at the 2024 GA. The amendments added words or phrases such as *spiritual development*, *mystery and wonder*, and *interdependence*, which the Commission believed were already incorporated in other ways.

A business resolution that would require the complete divestment of fossil fuel investments in the UUA Common Endowment Fund failed (32% to 68%). The UUA currently avoids fossil fuel investments but keeps a few for shareholder advocacy purposes.

Social justice resolutions were adopted supporting DACA and health equity, and opposing police misconduct.

Our Vision and Goal has always been to maintain and improve our site with respect for the interdependent web of all existence of which we are a part. We use no harmful chemicals or fertilizers. We continue to manage and improve the ecological web of life existing in our meadow and woodlands to encourage native species and remove non-native invasive ones, while at the same time making our site a welcoming place for visitors and congregants.

If you love plants or want to learn, or if you want to help at critical times of the year, please talk to someone on the UU Falmouth Grounds Committee. We look forward to being able to involve all those who wish to volunteer for outdoor projects and experience the wonder and fun of a site managed with sustainability in mind. We know we can always improve!

Building: We are working on various maintenance problems and outside projects. The immediate need is for people to do landscape type work. There will be an announcement for help in the future for outside work. We are still in need of a permanent chair for this committee.

COMMUNICATIONS COMMITTEE Update

The Communications Committee performs 5 primary operations for UU Falmouth:

- * Maintaining and updating the website, <https://uuffm.org>, also at <http://uufalmouth.org>.
- * Producing press releases about congregational and community events.
- * Creating frequent advertisements in the four Upper Cape editions of the *Enterprise* newspapers.
- * Maintaining activity on UU Falmouth's Facebook page, and on our Instagram presence.
- * Creating print and digital flyers to promote congregational events of community interest.

Communications plans to complete a broadcast Public Service Announcement soon. We seek more volunteers to join our 3-person team—Joanie Thompson and Nannette Oldenbourg, co-chairs; and Julia Withers. Training is available.

DENOMINATIONAL AFFAIRS COMMITTEE Update

Denominational Affairs assists with the congregation's relationship with other UU communities and the UUA in particular. The committee publicizes the UUA General Assembly and recommends to the Governing Board individuals to serve as delegates. It also sponsors workshops on denominational issues. The July 16 service is an example of its work. At the moment, Larry Ladd is the sole member.

FINANCE COMMITTEE Update

The Finance Committee meets on the second Thursday of each month at 7 PM via Zoom. We recently welcomed Gail Donkin and Barry Blake back onto the committee which now has ten members: Barry Blake, Dayle Carroll-Teal, Jonathan DiPaolo, Gail Donkin, Rudolf Oldenbourg, Bob Sabin, Gayle Simundza, Ellen Todd, Isabelle Williams, Rex Withers. We are always happy to consider new members. At each meeting we review the latest financial reports, and last month we considered some revised formatting of the reports. In the winter and spring, we work on the budget for the following fiscal year.

At the moment, we are contemplating our next audit of FY23 financial records. If anyone is interested in a short-term commitment, this is a good area to consider. We could also use an "insurance coordinator" for the fellowship's insurance policy; someone who is comfortable enough with sorting through insurance language. MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE Update

This committee is looking for additional members. At present our team includes Judy Andrade, Gail Donkin, Marion Flurkey, Karen Zimmerman, Maggie Jones from the Board, and Carolyn Powers, chair. Avis Grosslein is an emerita member. We meet monthly at the Meeting House, usually the second Thursday of the month.

Current metrics as of July 13 are 160 Members and 89 Friends. Kit introduced Carolyn to the new database Breeze that gives up-to-date information on visitors and inquiries as well. We are in need of greeters to join Carol McKeon in welcoming visitors to Sunday services, giving them name tags, and encouraging them to sign the guest book. Training is provided.

We are exploring ways to build membership, a responsibility we share with the entire congregation. We encourage all to bring a friend to Sunday services and introduce them to the fellowship activities and spiritual leadership available at UU Falmouth.

MUSIC COMMITTEE Update

The music committee continues to support the efforts of the music program at UU Falmouth. The committee is a sounding board and a clerical support group for the director and the choir in their endeavors to present music for all services, special concerts, musical events, and fundraisers.

The Music Committee sponsored two special Pernambuco concerts this year featuring Michael Goldring, and helped to present the yearly *Music Sunday Service* in June. The committee plans to continue bringing more concerts and special music to the UU Falmouth calendar next year.

The committee tries to meet monthly or as needed. Current committee members are: Susan Brooks, chair; Jim Liljestrang; Pamela Hughes; Celia Gayer; Nancy Wendlandt, Pianist; Frederick Johnson, Music Director.

We are presently seeking two or three new members.

RELIGIOUS SERVICES COMMITTEE Update

At the beginning of FY2023 (7/2022), we saw the end of zoom-only services. We started July off with a congregational breakfast in place of a service; we continued to meet outdoors in front of the Meeting House until moving back into the building in October when the HVAC system installation was completed. All services were hybrid (zoom and in person), which has been challenging. Our tech expert, Shannon Sylvia, was with us for eight months, after which John Jackson set up a tech task force to handle hybrid services.

As the RSC takes over responsibility for all services for the foreseeable future, we have discussed and made plans for inspiring, joyful, soul-satisfying Sunday services. Each month there will be a theme for Sunday services and Whole Life Learning:

Without a settled minister, RSC is planning a consistent rotation of service leadership each month. Starting in September, each month there will be one Sunday led by Rev. Saramaria Allenby; a Sunday that is lay led; one led by a guest minister (or speaker); and a service of music and readings. On months with five Sundays, we will begin with a social hour to be followed by Board and/or committee presentations or listening sessions. Each service will have an assigned service associate who will be the contact person for that service.

The Religious Services Committee welcomes ideas and suggestions for lay led and guest led services. Topics and contact information may be sent to any RSC member. Decisions are made at monthly RSC meetings. RSC committee members include co-chairs Julie DeSorgher and Judy Andrade, Rosa Whiting, Kathi Sommers, Tedi Bell, Charlotte Harris, tech liaison John Jackson, and musicians Fred Johnson and Nancy Wendlandt.

We are looking for volunteers to join, or work with, the RSC to assist in putting on services – to work with guest ministers or speakers, lay leaders, or to lead services. We will train anyone who is interested and have scripts and instructions to make the process clear and easy to follow. Please consider being a part of this important enterprise as we move ahead in this new chapter of our UU Falmouth life.

WELCOMING CONGREGATION COMMITTEE Update

UU Falmouth is re-certified annually by the UUA as a *Welcoming Congregation*, reflecting our on-going commitment to LGBTQIA+ inclusion and support in the church and in the community. To qualify for certification, the committee provides educational and community service activities.

WCC hosted Prof. Sandra Faiman-Silva for a Sunday service on community activism, and Scott Fitzmaurice, director of THRIVE!, for a Sunday service on affordable housing options on the Cape, including shared housing for LGBTQ folks. WCC, along with Whole Life Learning, offered a workshop by Tracy Morin on gender identity and allyship, and a wonderful concert by Spencer LaJoye, a queer singer song-writer.

We donated to THRIVE!, the Gay and Straight Youth Alliance in Hyannis; highlighted several LGBTQ Days of Observance in the SRM; and added to UU Falmouth's Library collection of LGBTQ books. Lastly, we encircled our Meeting House with our beautiful rainbow banner in June for a highly visible statement of pride and support in these difficult times.

We staffed a table at the Cape Pride Festival in Hyannis on July 22, and plan on having Tracy Morin give a Sunday service in October.

We would love to have new members join our committee, which currently consists of: Judy LeBeau, Bill Donkin, Michael Goldring, Linda Hickman and Jim Liljestrand.
