RELIGIOUS SERVICES IN AUGUST

August 3 at 10 AM at the Meeting House and via Zoom—"A Rebirth of Wonder" led by Rev. Rali Weaver; service associate, Tedi Bell. In a world often driven by routine, cynicism, and urgency, how do we keep our sense of wonder alive? Drawing from the wisdom of poets, prophets, and everyday awe, this Sunday's service invites us to rediscover the sacred in the ordinary and rekindle our capacity for reverence, curiosity, and joy. Together, we'll explore how "a rebirth of wonder" can be not only a personal awakening but a spiritual practice that grounds us in our UU values of interconnectedness, openness, and love.

August 10 at 10 AM at the Meeting House and via Zoom—"The Oversoul Within: Transcendentalism for Today" led by Rev. Rali Weaver; service associate, Rosa Whiting. What does it mean to trust the still, small voice within? Rooted in the teachings of Emerson and the Transcendentalists, this service explores the idea of the "Oversoul"—a deep, shared spirit that connects us to one another, to nature, and to the divine. In a time of noise and distraction, how can we return to the wisdom of inner knowing and cultivate a spirituality of presence, authenticity, and interconnection?

Governing Board Report



Dear Members and Friends,

Climate change hit Church Mutual Insurance pretty hard and they are passing the hit on to UU Falmouth. First, they said they wouldn't insure us unless we changed all the electric panels—the Meeting House has five panels and they're expensive. Buildings & Grounds (B&G) collected information, fought the insurer on that, and got them to drop the requirement but not change their position on annual costs going up—a lot

A B&G team, composed of Rex Withers, Phil Zimmerman and Stu Graham, has spent hours and hours reading and comparing insurance contracts to find us the best deal we can get. The first hour of the Board's July meeting was a report of their findings, and a discussion of which insurer to choose, and what the criteria for choice should be. Is it price alone or does financial stability and record of service matter just as much or maybe more? The upshot so far is that the insurance team will make a final recommendation to the Board before the August meeting so we can be confident that we will have a signed agreement with a property, liability, and umbrella policy insurer before our current Church Mutual policy expires September 1st.

The main goal of our three-year plan is to call a full-time minister and grow our congregation. We have called the minister and now we are focusing on growing the congregation. Our whole budget is devoted to this mission by providing everything we think we need to succeed. In the second hour of July's meeting, we talked about using T-shirts and caps for UUs to wear at standouts to increase our visibility in the broader community. We'll see if people want the t-shirts we purchased for the "Good Trouble" standout at Bourne Rotary before ordering more. The meeting concluded with the treasurer's report.
