## RELIGIOUS SERVICES IN JANUARY

This month's Soul Matters theme is **Practicing Resistance**. As we think about resistance, consider the words of the Dalia Lama, "If you think you are too small to make a difference, try sleeping with a mosquito."

**January 4 at 10 AM at the Meeting House and via Zoom—“Revolutionary Love”** led by Rev. Rali Weaver; service associate, Tedi Bell. This Sunday, we draw powerful inspiration from The Reverend Dr. Jacqui Lewis and the legacy of the Revolutionary Love Conferences at Middle Collegiate Church. We will explore her theology of “Fierce Love”—a rule-breaking, boundary-dismantling commitment that calls us to move beyond mere tolerance to true liberation.

**January 11 at 10 AM at the Meeting House and via Zoom—“Forward Together”** led by Rev. Rali Weaver; service associate, Ellen Todd. This Sunday, we dive into the inspiring, unwavering ministry of The Reverend Dr. William Barber II, co-chair of the Poor People's Campaign. We explore his question, “If we could truly harness the power of *us working together*, what impossible mountains could we move?” Come explore a vision of justice where solidarity is our strongest weapon and reconciliation is our ultimate goal.

**\*Share the Plate January 11 will go to the UUSC Emergency Response Fund.** UUSC's Emergency Response Fund provides vital assistance to people impacted by natural or human-made disasters, but whose access to aid is very limited. By contributing to this restricted fund, you can help UUSC and our grassroots partners equitably and effectively respond to a crisis as soon as it occurs—and over the long-term.

**January 18 at 10 AM at the Meeting House and via Zoom—“Don’t Ask What I Believe, Ask What I Do”** led by Tom Kirkman, a longtime member of the UU Society for Community Ministries and retired MA judge; service associate, Joanne Treistman. A number of years ago, our former settled minister, Rev. Bob Murphy, provided us with the phrase “Don’t ask what I believe, ask what I do.” It was a measured, compassionate response to a question of what do Unitarian Universalists believe. Ours is a relational religion and our ministry is about living in right relation to others. The more intentional community ministries of working outside our parish halls and church walls are as old as American Unitarian and Universalism, and as young as today. As we celebrate the birth and legacy of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. this weekend, we consider Rev. Murphy’s phrase by honoring our UU principles and practices that shape a caring and loving community by seeking justice for all.

**January 25 at 10 AM at the Meeting House and via Zoom—“Reconciliation vs. Defeat”** led by Rev. Rali Weaver; service associate, Noreen Cavanaugh. This Sunday, we explore the deep difference between defeat—a surrender driven by exhaustion or coercion, and reconciliation—a courageous, mutual effort to heal a rift and forge a new way forward. We will look at how Unitarian Universalist values call us to move beyond adversarial thinking in our personal lives, our communities, and our pursuit of justice.

Now, back in New England, I'm reminded that winter offers much more than just a time for snow, ice, and seeds to stratify. It is a season of quiet preparation—a gift of indoor time we avoid during the warmer months. It's the perfect opportunity for the deep, necessary work: cleaning out closets, organizing file cabinets, getting dust out of hidden corners, and, most importantly, planning the vibrant gardens and future events that will burst forth in spring.

This winter at UU Falmouth, I hope we can embrace this spirit of preparation. Just as we clear out the old files and tidy our physical space, I also invite us to dedicate time to organizing our communal vision.

Specifically, I am eager to begin planning a big celebration for my installation on May 16th. This public ceremony, which formally adopts me as your minister, is more than just a formality. It is a moment to honor all we have already built, and to leverage our visibility to communicate the exciting future we are committed to creating together at UU Falmouth. I chose to wait until spring for the ceremony so my family—my daughters, mother-in-law, and father—could be here to share the celebration with all of you.

Much like planning a garden, planning an installation can be a powerful act of planting seeds for the congregation's future. My hope is that we can couple this important ceremony with a Spring Fair on the morning of May 16th. This would be a wonderful opportunity to invite families with children into our space and introduce them to our warm, welcoming community.

This is where I need your input!

Whether this idea excites you or gives you pause, I want to hear your voice. It takes a village to plan any big event, and the installation of a minister is no different.

If that date doesn't work, please feel free to schedule an appointment with me anytime to share your ideas, concerns, or vision for our future.

I hope you will join me in this season of planning and preparing the ground so that May 16th will be a celebration to remember.

**Saturday, January 17 at 10 AM at the Meeting House**




