## RELIGIOUS SERVICES IN JULY & AUGUST

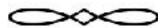
**July 5 at 10 AM at the Meeting House and via Zoom—“Freedom For All? - Past and Future”** led by Joanne and Steve Treistman. There will be a reading of the July 4, 1776 Declaration of Independence, historic declarations from the Wampanoag, and words from Frederick Douglass and Margaret Chase Smith. Patriots in the audience will give reasons for independence! There will be readings on the theme of the second UU Principle of justice, equity and compassion in human relations. Music will include patriotic and historic anthems and Carolyn McDade music.

**July 12 at 10 AM at the Meeting House and via Zoom—“Meeting the Moment”** led by Larry Ladd; service associate, Judy Andrade. These times challenge our core social beliefs more than at any other time in our own memories. What does Unitarian Universalism have to say about meeting this moment?

**Share the Plate: The Beyond Bond & Legal Defense Fund** raises money for immigration bonds to free people in ICE prisons who are coming to Massachusetts upon release.

Dear UU Falmouth Friends,

In the heat of summer, our days often pick up a different kind of momentum. The sun stays with us longer, the air thickens, and the natural world reaches its peak of vibrant, unhurried growth. In our Unitarian Universalist tradition, our Seventh Principle reminds us of our place within the interdependent web of all existence. Summer invites us to move beyond simply acknowledging this truth intellectually and to feel it in our very bones.

One of the most profound ways to experience this connection is through Shinrin-yoku, the Japanese practice of forest bathing. This isn't a strenuous hike or an exercise in identifying species; it is simply being present in the woods, letting the sights, sounds, and smells wash over you. Science is increasingly catching up to what our spirits have always known: spending intentional time under a canopy of leaves fundamentally restores us. When we breathe in the forest air, we inhale phytoncides—airborne chemicals that plants emit to protect themselves. In our bodies, these compounds trigger vital health benefits, significantly lowering blood pressure, reducing stress hormones like cortisol, and boosting our immune system's natural defense cells.

But the restoration goes even deeper than biological wellness. It is a homecoming. In my wife's favorite book, the beautiful novel The Overstory, Richard Powers writes: "You and the tree in your backyard come from a common ancestor. A billion and a half years ago, the two of you parted ways. But even now, after an immense journey in separate directions, that tree and you still share a quarter of your genes."

I invite you to think of that as you walk outside this season. The oak in the park or the pine in your backyard is quite literally family. When we step into nature, we are not visiting a destination; we are returning to our relatives.

This summer, I invite you to make time for this sacred reunion. Find a patch of shade, leave your phone behind, and let the trees tend to your body and soul. Breathe deeply, remember your lineage, and find rest in the shade of our ancient cousins.

Enjoy the summer! And remember to breathe in the trees!

**Grosslein Award:** The Grosslein Award was created in honor of Marv and Avis Grosslein, long time members and stewards of our Fellowship. Each year the Governing Board identifies members who have provided long term service to the congregation for these awards. The service recognized is often largely invisible to the Fellowship members but is absolutely critical. This year's recipients are:

**Barry Blake** — Barry has offered his deep expertise in accounting through long term service on the Finance Committee. In particular, he has been the point person for multiple financial audits, including one undertaken over the past year. His detailed analysis of our finances has helped to ensure our financial security, and it makes us all confident of the accuracy and completeness of our financial reports. Just as important, Barry undertakes the work of the Finance Committee with warmth and a smile.

**Rex Withers** — Rex serves the congregation on both the Building and Grounds Committee and the Finance Committee. His careful attention to detail is fundamental to the work of both committees. On the Building and Grounds Committee, he has been the point person for our air handling system, helping to ensure comfortable temperatures while also maximizing the energy efficiency of the system. He has saved the congregation thousands of dollars in electric costs while keeping us cool in the summer and warm in the winter. He has also taken the lead on our insurance issues, digging into the details of very complex insurance documents, comparing policies, working with the UUA, and making sure that we are adequately insured. On the Finance Committee, Rex manages our investment accounts and reviews bookkeeping software entries to help the Finance Committee in its review of monthly accounts.

**Caring Committee Award:** The Caring Committee Award is given each year to a person who goes above and beyond caring for others and helping in a multitude of ways to make people's lives better. This year's recipient is:

**Pam Morrone** — Pam serves the community in *so many ways!* She spearheads the grocery store card sales each week, which results in our Fellowship's ability to support environmental and social justice organizations every year. She offers rides to people when they need to get to church, to a doctor's appointment, etc. She volunteers with the Cape Cod Foster Closet at the Meeting House, helping it to succeed and expand. She works with SEAC sending out postcards encouraging people to vote. She is organizing a team from the Fellowship to volunteer at the Falmouth Road Race, thereby securing a donation to our congregation. In short, she is everywhere, doing whatever needs to be done. She is critical to the life and function of our Fellowship, but you may not even be aware of her tireless work.
