Hello My Falmouth Friends,

June 8th is an uncommon day. Not only will you be holding your Annual Meeting in Falmouth and voting whether or not to call me as your full-time Minister at 11:30 AM, at almost the exact same time Dedham will be hosting a goodbye party for me. To organize UU's to have a Hello and Goodbye on the same day at the same hour is uncommon.

Many of you have asked the same questions after reading my packet (www.raliweaver.com),so I will answer them here to be sure everyone gets the same answer.

If I am called:

- 1. How long will I give the UU Falmouth Congregation given that I am turning 60 this year? The short answer, of course, is who knows? Life has a way of making plans for us. However, I have always thought I would stay in the ministry at least until I am 70 years old and to be honest, I would rather not go into search ever again. So I am feeling committed to UU Falmouth for at least a decade, health and church growth permitting.
- Where will I live? My wife Jenny is wrapping up her 28 years of teaching and we are moving to Falmouth together. A friend has offered us a house while we search for our new home. If you call me as your settled minister, we plan to buy a house in the Upper Cape.

From July through August 15, I will be packing up and moving from the Dedham parsonage, where I have lived since 2007. Eighteen years is the longest I have ever lived anywhere in my life. So, while this culling and moving is familiar to me, doing it with a family in tow is new. Not to mention that I am eighteen years out of practice.

Transitions are both exciting and hard. I am equally familiar with the discomfort, grief and joy associated with hellos and goodbyes. I am so grateful to all of you who have worked to make this process easier. I will know more about my schedule and my contract with you after June 8th but, as always, I am available by phone, Zoom and in person. I can drive to Falmouth with an hour's notice as we transition to living on the Cape full time, whether I am your contract or called minister in the coming year.

President's Corner



Dear Members and Friends,

First a Board report and then a recap on "President's Messages."

The Board meeting on May 15th was primarily to prepare for the Annual Meeting coming up on June 8th. A special early session focused on the Discernment Committee's recommendation concerning calling a full-time settled minister. The committee reported overwhelming congregational enthusiasm for Rali, citing her warmth, energy, and positive impact. The Board unanimously endorsed the recommendation, and the congregation will vote on the matter at the Annual Meeting. The Board also discussed and approved the proposed FY25-26 budget of \$395,250, which reflects increased pledges and supports the full-time ministry. This remarkable amount testifies to the congregation's very strong desire to grow and to have a full-time Minister. The Board accepted the Finance Committee's recommendation with very few changes. The key budget adjustment was increasing the advertising/communications budget by some \$13,000, which the Communications Committee requested to support their strategy in support of full-time ministry. The Board also discussed recognizing volunteers with multiple awards, including a "Long Time Service" award. Finally, the Board covered old business, including updates on the AV project, emergency protocol, and insurance, as well as on-going reports from the Treasurer, Buildings and Grounds, and Membership committees. As it has been for two years now, the meeting was relaxed, friendly—and finished only slightly overtime.

Now, the recap on "President's Messages."

Back when I was doing *Sandscript* (2004 to 2011) the Board president didn't do a message, only the minister did a whole page message. At most, there would be a brief Board report in a section called Fellowship Life. Later, I think Carolyn Powers, maybe during the interim ministry period after Laurel Hallman left, started a column she called President's Corner that expanded during interims to a full-page president's message.

This might change soon because we will probably have a full-time called minister who will definitely be the head of the Fellowship. Consequently, the Board and the officers of the Board can step back into their historic roles—no longer responsible for administration and policy implementation, but only for policy, planning and oversight. Yes, we will still have fiduciary responsibility and we must keep the membership informed of our actions, but the more strenuous lifting will be over. I believe we will all be very glad; certainly I will be.

So, this is my last President's Corner before a retreat to a brief Board report. Thank you everyone for all the hope and resources and good will and work you have poured into our Fellowship during this time of rebuilding our harmony. The cooperation and good humor made the tasks easy; the sense of belonging and 'being in the know' made the work joyful. Thank you Board and congregation members for this experience.

Annual Pledge Drive

"Together We Did!"

News from the Pledge Drive:

The 2025-2026 "Together We Can!" pledge drive was a resounding success! Our goal was to establish that we are a fiscally sound congregation with a membership dedicated to attracting and retaining a settled minister. As of Sunday, May 18, we have 98 pledges in hand for a total of \$380,600 with about 10 additional pledges pending, which we expect to bring the total to \$395,000. This is an 18% increase over last year's remarkably successful drive, which was a 15% increase over the previous year. Every pledge of every size contributed to our success.

In a very short three years, and with all the unknowns of the current economy, the congregation has demonstrated that "Together We Can" build a financially strong fellowship ready to call a full-time minister. Significantly, this year's pledge saw a net increase in the number of individuals or families pledging to the fellowship, a further sign of the vibrancy of this fellowship. If you have not yet sent in your pledge card, it is not too late! Please contact David or Jessica, or Izzie Williams, so that your pledge can be included in the final total announced at the Annual Meeting on June 8th.

The Discernment Team's Recommendation

STEP ONE in our journey to decide whether to call Rev. Rali to be our settled minister was to establish that we were a fiscally sound congregation...and we did!

STEP TWO was the formation of a Discernment Team, consisting of Judy Lynch, Tom Kirkman, and Larry Ladd (facilitator). They were charged with deciding whether to recommend Rev. Rali Weaver to be our settled minister...and they did!

The team held extensive meetings with the congregation during the first two weeks of May. These consultations included committees, staff, three sessions open to anyone in the congregation, and the offer to have one-on-one conversations. All of the consultations were affirmative to calling Rali Weaver as the settled minister.

At its regular meeting on May 15, the Governing Board endorsed the Discernment Team's recommendation to call Rev. Rali Weaver as our settled minister.

STEP THREE: Now it is up to the members of UU Falmouth to attend the Annual Meeting on June 8 and vote on a recommendation to call Rev. Rali as our settled minister.
