October 27 at 10 AM at the Meeting House and via Zoom—Curiosity, Compassion, and Caring, led by Rev. Rali Weaver; service associate John Jackson. How we approach even tricky conversations can change the solutions we can find. This week we will explore the foundations of Internal Family Systems Therapy and how understanding our parts might help us to listen more deeply.

The Soul Matters theme for October is "Deep Listening." I wonder who among us would not want to be more deeply listened to? To be understood?

The great Zen teacher Thich Nhat Hanh once said "Deep listening is the kind of listening that can help relieve the suffering of another person." He points out that deep listening can also be called compassionate listening. It takes practice. It is also easier with people we care about than people we barely know. This month's worship will explore how developing deep listening, in all its many forms, can be a way of interacting in the world.

To aid us in this deep listening, I am offering a book group on four Sundays in October at 4 PM on Zoom. The book we will read is *How to Know a Person* by David Brooks. This book explores the intricacies of human relationships and the art of truly understanding others. Through insightful anecdotes and reflections, Brooks encourages readers to cultivate meaningful relationships, highlighting that the essence of knowing another person lies in the shared experiences and emotional bonds that enrich our lives. Through reading and discussion and practice, I hope this book discussion group will also help us all to deepen our listening skills.

If you would be interested in joining me for this, just reach out to Kit or me and we can send you the Zoom link. I am opening this up to the Dedham congregation as well, so there may be some unfamiliar faces. I hope Zoom study groups will be one way we can collaborate going forward this year.

Hello Members and Friends,

I am very pleased to report to you that our Fellowship's finances are in good shape. You know we had a very successful stewardship campaign, but you may not know yet that two long term projects, an audit of FY2022 and a revision of our chart of accounts, have been completed so we can return to expecting complete, accurate financial reports on a monthly basis. Here are the bottom lines on the report given to the Board last Thursday at its regular meeting:

We owe thanks to several people for taking responsibility for our finances: Gail Donkin and Izzie Williams, Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer; Gayle Simundza, Finance Chair; and Barry Blake, Audit Chair. And we thank Members and Friends, our generous and loyal donors.

UUs are famous for committees and coffee hour but we are slipping dangerously in both areas. Some committees have too few people and our coffee hour is sputtering. After two recent services, there was no coffee! How can such a thing happen to us? How can we keep leaning on the willing and not feel moved to give a helping hand? Will you serve on the **Hospitality Committee**? Please sign up on the bulletin board next to the new Communications Room* and we will get in touch with you. You'll get training, you'll have support, and you'll feel good knowing you're giving useful service.

Two committees need new leaders. **Membership** needs a new chair because Carolyn Powers is moving soon; and **Finance** needs a new chair because Gayle Simundza feels she's done this long enough and who can deny it? They have been very good leaders and we thank them. These are critical committees with long-term members, so a new recruit will have support and a heartfelt welcome for stepping into leadership.

Other vital committees need more members: **Building and Grounds** suffered a big loss this summer, and while Dave Crichton has stepped into Bob Sabin's shoes as chair, new members are needed to help do the work. The **Social and Environmental Action Committee** could also use more volunteers.

Every day and week of our lives we each need to give meaning to our covenant. No one else can do it for us. Giving service can be tiring, it's a lot to ask, but you know yourself from the times you have lived up to it, it's really satisfying.


Book Discussion Led by Rev. Rali Weaver

Starting Point Program

Saturdays, October 19, November 2 & 16, and December 7 from 9:30-11:30 AM at the Meeting House and via Zoom

The Membership Committee is once again offering a unique program designed for Members, Friends and newcomers. UU Falmouth is at an inflection point and the committee believes that **Starting Point** could be useful to us all as we seek to heal disconnections and grow a welcoming UU community for the Upper Cape.

At the March 24, 2024 service, we introduced this program, inspired by the UU slogan "deeds not creeds." **Starting Point** does not present a set of beliefs, but rather many opportunities to experience the deep listening and sharing practices inherent in UU small groups. Participants are invited to look within themselves for direction in their spiritual journey and are asked to prepare for each of four session topics:

Session 1 – Your Journey

Session 2 – The UU Journey and the Journey of UU Falmouth

Session 3 – Our Journey Together – The 3 Paths of Unitarian Universalism

Session 4 – Finding Your Journey Group

The program promises several takeaways: an understanding of UU history and the history of this congregation, a new connection to your fellow participants, an experience of UU small group practices, and a sense of the next step in your spiritual journey. It is important to commit to all 4 sessions, either in person or by Zoom.

Sessions 1 and 2 will be offered October 19 and November 2 from 9:30–11:30 AM; sessions 3 and 4 will be November 16 and December 7 from 9:30–11:30 AM. L.I.N.K. (Linking Indigenous & Non-Indigenous Knowledge) Program Wampanoag Language

Saturday, October 26 from 1-3 PM at the Meeting House

Although not fluently spoken for over 150 years, the return of the Wampanoag language to its people has marked a renewal of cultural knowledge and connection. Dr. Nitana Hicks Greendeer, member of the Mashpee Wampanoag Tribe, who has worked for over 20 years in tribal language, will discuss the story of loss and reclamation. She will also talk about the Wampanoag Nation's efforts to bring it back as a principal means of communication for its people.

L.I.N.K. is a local non-profit Cape Cod organization seeking pathways to understanding and reciprocity between the non-Native community and the Wampanoag Nation. They also teach non-Natives about the true history and culture of the Wampanoag people. This program is a collaboration between L.I.N.K. and UU Falmouth in an effort to change the current environment of societal injustice and to heal relations. It is open to the public. Our congregation-wide effort to get out the vote in November is in full swing. We're continuing to write letters through Vote Forward to registered voters in swing states who don't vote.
