If I learn of any events happening, in person or virtual, we will make sure to get the word out right away. But for now, hold on, and take care of yourself and each other. Drink water. Eat something. Try your best to get some rest. Do what you need to do to take care of yourself physically and emotionally. That way, when it's time to act, you'll be ready.

I have no idea what is going to happen. I know I'm hugging my family extra close, and in my heart I am hugging each and every one of you. I said this past summer that the moment calls for us to be an explicitly anti-fascist and anti-racist congregation. That is true now more than ever. We must name this moment for what it is: this is an attempt at a fascist coup. As a faith that affirms to promote the democratic process, we oppose what is happening in the strongest possible terms. We will do our part to preserve and rebuild democracy in the wake of this moment.

Whatever the future brings, we will face it together. I promise you that.
