Position Description

General Description: The Unitarian Universalist Fellowship of Falmouth (UU Falmouth) is looking for a creative and enthusiastic leader to manage the development, delivery, and coordination of UU Falmouth's learning programs for all ages. If you are excited by the prospect of working with an energetic professional staff and congregation that is looking to transition its RE offerings from one mainly focused on children and youth to one that also serves the multi-faceted RE needs of adults, this position is for you. Our vision for this new program, Whole Life Learning (WLL), is at the heart of our ministry, rooted in the seven principles of Unitarian Universalism. In partnership with the minister and WLL Committee, you will have the opportunity to shape a new program that aims to support individuals at all life stages in developing their whole selves (spiritual, physical, emotional, and intellectual) as well as deepen connections between all ages in an authentic multi-generational UU community.

The Director of Whole Life Learning reports to the minister and is supported by and supports the Whole Life Learning Committee. The Director also provides monthly reports to their supervisor and attends board meetings as needed for board education on the program. The program is supported by an annual budget (2020-2021, \$5000) and funds are budgeted for start-up expenses (\$10,000). Additional funding can be requested as needed.

This 20-hours per week position includes two Sundays per month, one for youth programs and one for direct intergenerational programs, social presence, or other program needs as decided in consultation with the minister and Whole Life Learning Committee.

It is anticipated that all UU Falmouth programs and services will be exclusively online through at least May 2021.

UU Falmouth is committed to representing our local community, being an anti-oppressive and inclusive faith community, and developing a diverse and talented staff team. People with disabilities, people of color, indigenous people, Hispanic/Latinx, and LGBTQ+ candidates are encouraged to apply. If you are excited about this role and are unsure whether you meet 100% of the requirements, we encourage you to inquire and/or apply.

About our congregation: The Mission of UU Falmouth is to create a welcoming Unitarian Universalist community where we are inspired to lead our best lives and better our community and our world. We are a Welcoming Congregation and a certified Green Sanctuary. Our meetinghouse in Falmouth is the hub for a myriad of spiritual, educational, social and community service activities. Our UU Falmouth family includes about 200 members and many friends from Falmouth and the surrounding communities of Upper Cape Cod and Southeastern Massachusetts. Currently our programming includes presentations, films, and discussions to probe issues we care about (e.g., current events that relate to social, racial, and environmental justice). Throughout the year we have a variety of special multigenerational events, including holiday parties, beach cleanups, and Family Butterfly Hours (a multigenerational version of our casual open-mic Zoom storytelling). For our children and youth, we offer UUA Faith Formation programing such as OWL (Our Whole Lives) and Neighboring Faiths. We have a small but active youth group for grades 7 through 12. We are planning to continue and grow all of these programs from a radically inclusive approach, by challenging and changing deeply ingrained cultural habits and expanding our work beyond Sunday mornings.

Duties and Responsibilities

- Collaborate with the Minister, staff, WLL Committee and other committees to accomplish the WLL mission and goals. This includes, but is not limited to, weekly meetings with the minister, monthly with staff, and monthly with WLL committee
- Manage program development and delivery according to annual goals set with the minister
- Coordinate, manage, train and support as needed program volunteers and presenters
- Work with Communications to publicize and communicate about programs
- Manage program registration and record-keeping
- Work with Building and Grounds and Technology to coordinate and manage program facilities and on-line delivery platforms
- Measure and assess program delivery and results to ensure quality, and continually build and evaluate and improve programs
